 WASH, and Good Governance



Pilot in 3 communities in Nanumba South Experience sharing workshop for GMF husband & wife teams reported:

- Appreciation for husbands' support to take care of children & keep them well-fed
- Husbands support with cleaning inside and outside of the house
- Both reported more peace and joy in the house
- Men support women in small ruminants rearing & transport to markets for trading
