GLOBAL FOOD SECURITY ACT

- Enacted in July 2016
 - Strong **bipartisan support**
 - **Validated FtF approach**
 - **Authorized \$1 billion annually** for global food security
 - more than \$1.25 billion for the Emergency Food Security Program
 - Requires a whole-of-USG approach, and a five-year **Global Food Security Strategy**

- Strategy covers **FY2017-FY2021**
 - Builds on Feed the Future experience
 - **Reflects learning and analysis**
 - **External consultations**
- Includes **implementation plans** for individual agencies and departments

Goal: Sustainably reduce global hunger, malnutrition, and poverty

Objective 1

Inclusive and sustainable agricultural-led economic growth

Objective 2

Strengthened resilience among people and systems

Objective 3

A well-nourished population, especially among women and children

IR 1

Strengthened inclusive agriculture systems that are productive and profitable

IR 2

Strengthened and expanded access to markets and trade

IR 3

Increased employment and entrepreneurship

IR 4

Increased sustainable productivity, particularly through climate-smart approaches

IR 5

Improved proactive risk reduction, mitigation, and management

IR 6

Improved adaptation to and recovery from shocks and stresses

IR 7

Increased consumption of nutritious and safe diets

IR 8

Increased use of direct nutrition interventions and services

IR 9

More hygienic household and community environments

Cross-Cutting Intermediate Results (IR)

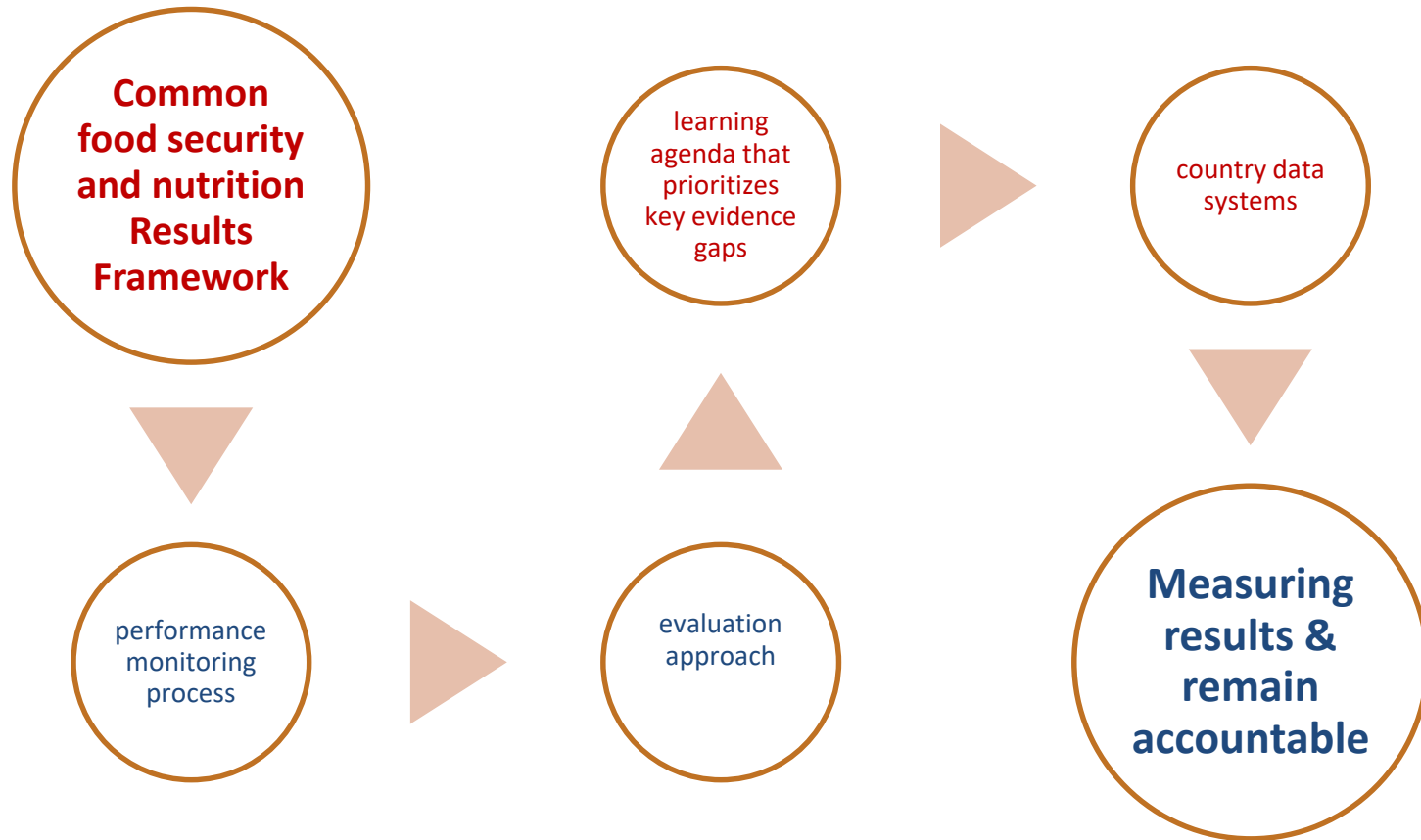

- Stakeholder **collaboration platforms**
