Stop Repository

Portal exists beyond projects

Share our collective achievements and lessons learned

Share the USAID impact story via 'Did you Know?'

Enhance research - access to data and information

Enhance user experience with depth of data and info

Market the portal to different users



## What types of data/documents should IPs share?

Туре	Detail
Data	Spatial and Non-spatial data: Project data, survey data – disaggregated at the district, regional, ZOI, national, gender, etc.
Reports and Other documents	Quarterly and annual reports, survey reports, papers, briefs, manuals, guides, success stories, newsletters, presentations, videos, audio, etc.
Performance Information	Performance Indicator Reference Sheets, Results Framework



## What types of data/documents should IPs share?

Relevant Links	Existing ones on ghanalinks.org include GIS web pages/maps and/or Story line – FinGAP, RING, SPRING and SFMP



### How should they share it? - Data

#### **METSS** Requests Data from IPs

METSS shares data template with IPs

IPs submit data in own data format



#### IPs Submit Data via email as

**CSV** 

CSV with Geospatial data (data with longitude and latitude) if available




