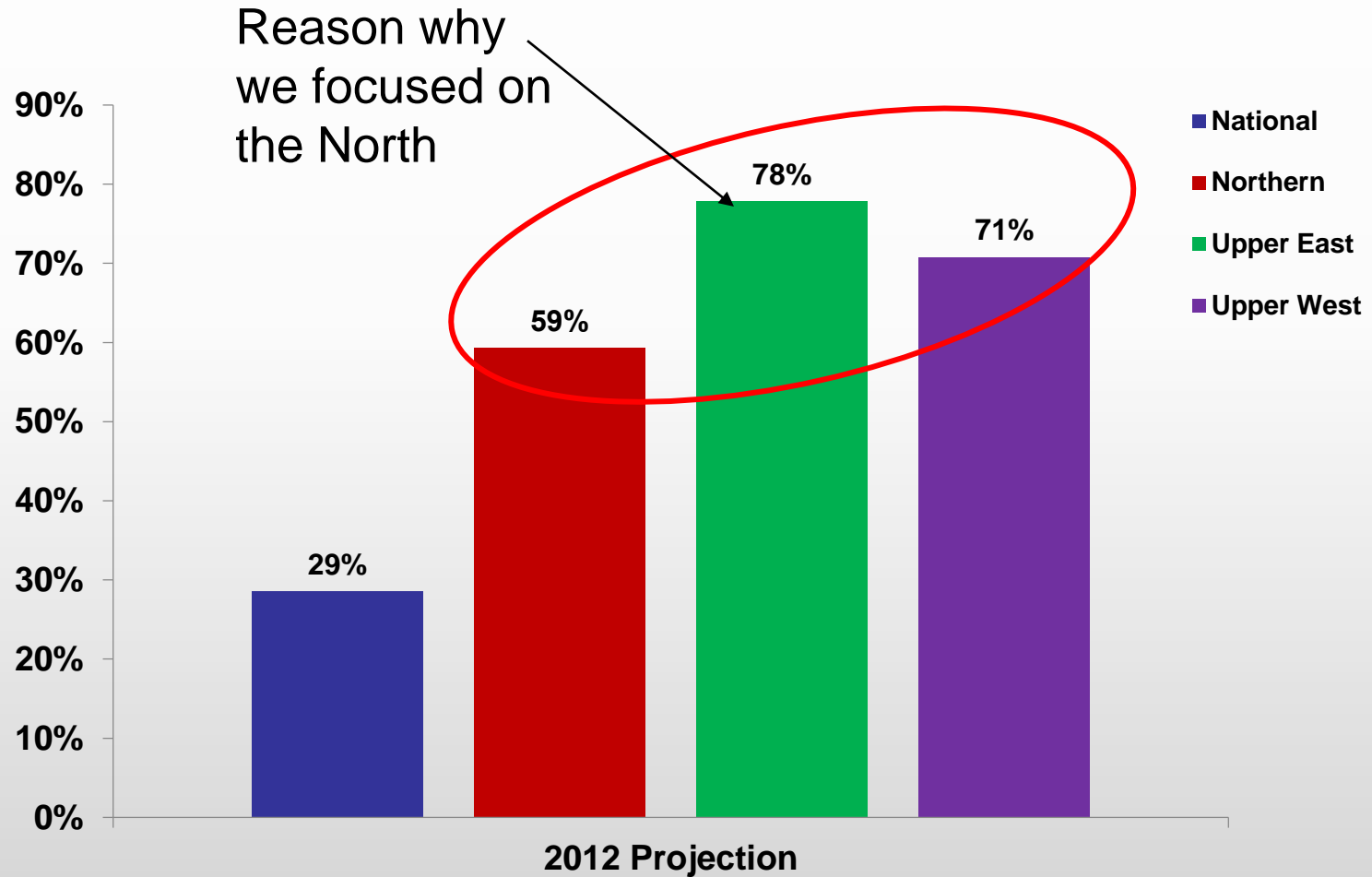

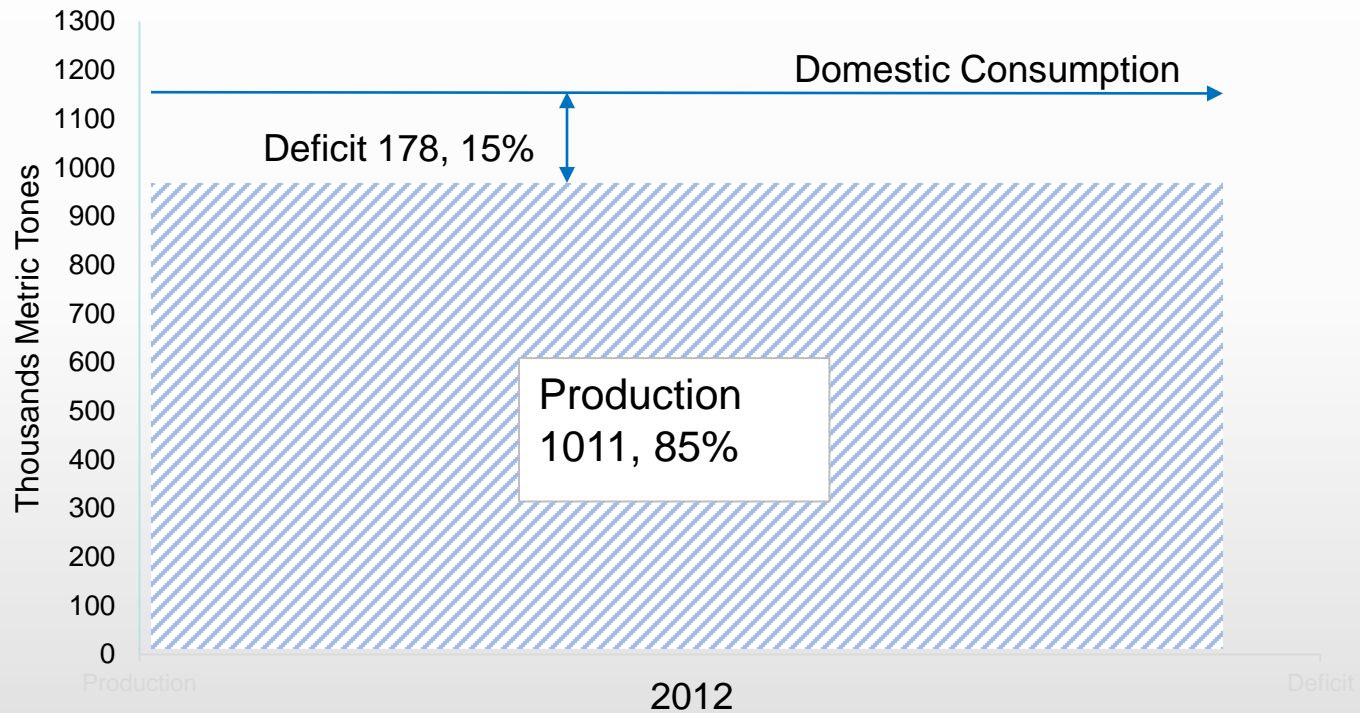


# Poverty rates before FTF Implementation



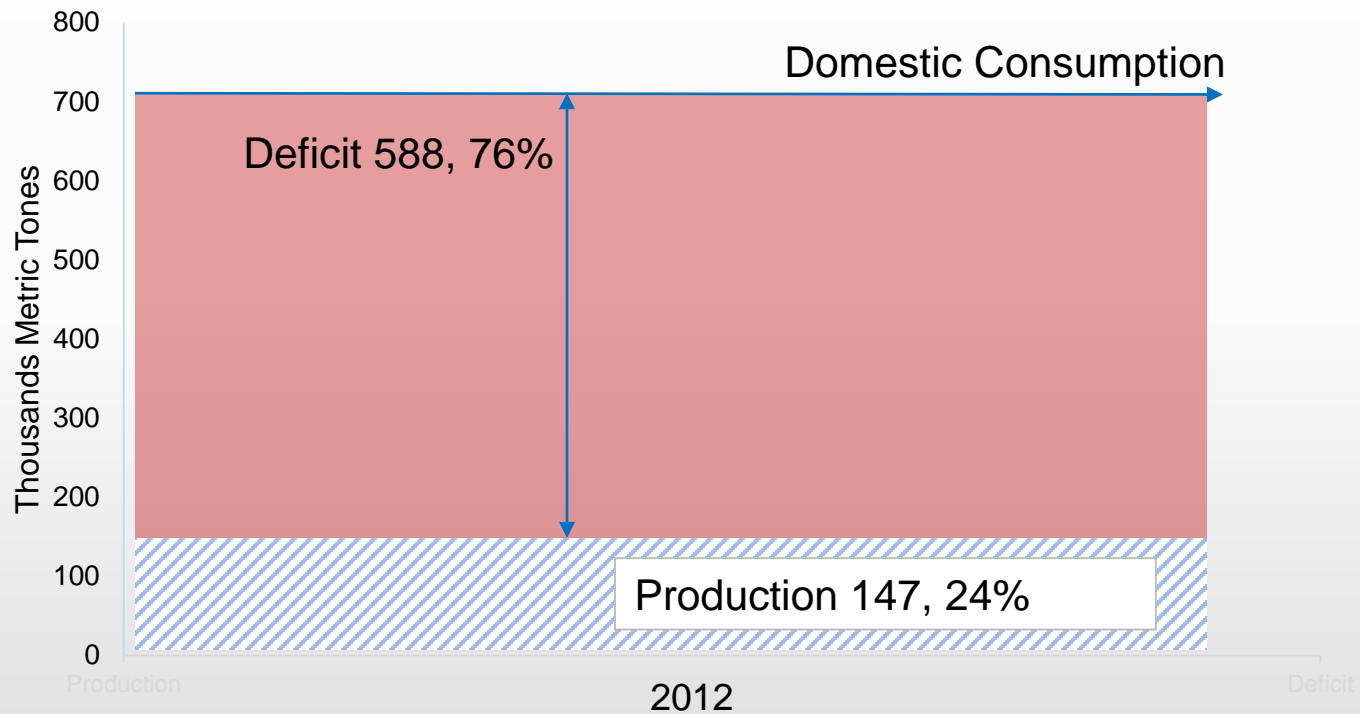


## Maize Domestic Consumption, Supply and deficit,





### Rice Domestic Consumption, Supply and deficit,

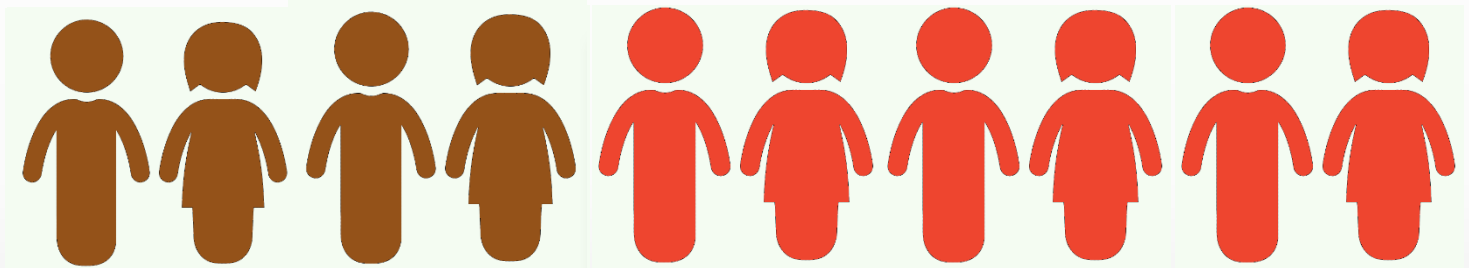

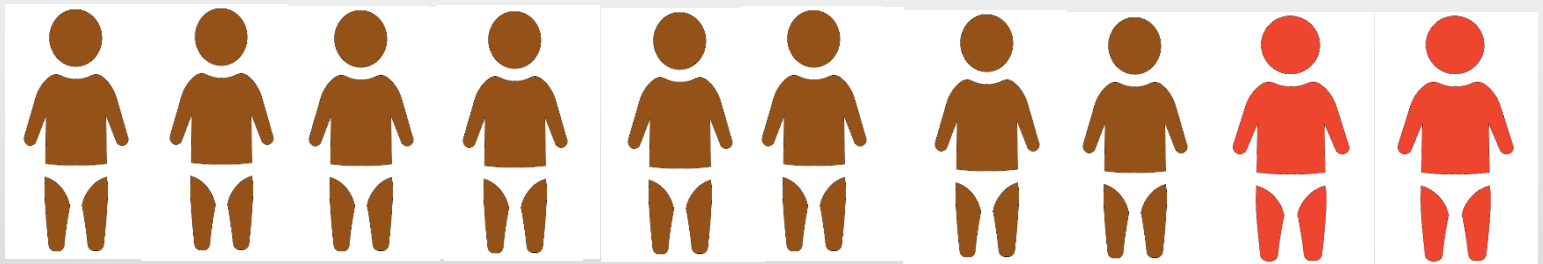

Period: 2013-2018, Geographical Context: 3 NRs, above 8<sup>th</sup> Parallel



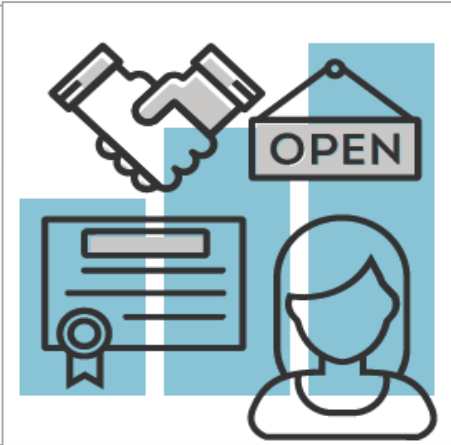

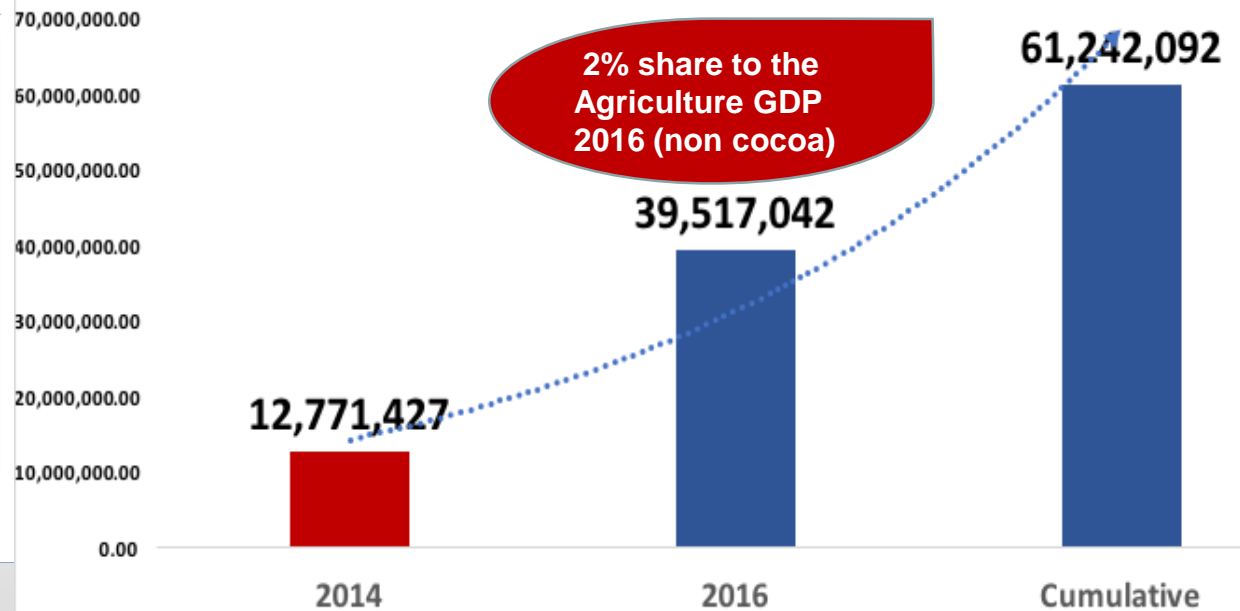
