RING Goals & Objectives

- Poverty and malnutrition reduction
 - 20% reduction in anemia, underweight, stunting, and wasting
 - 80% of households increase income by 100%
- Direct funding & implementation through GOG
 - 17 MMDAs
 - 7 Departments of the NRCC
- Strengthens existing systems for sustainable results







Conflicts: Reality or Over-hyped?

Conflicts are a reality in Northern Ghana

Significant impact on the socio-economic activities

Conflict affected communities

 Left out of development opportunities due to danger (real or perceived)



Conflicts are, however, localized





RING Approach to Preventing Conflicts

RING approach is preventive

 Primarily addresses economic drivers and socio-cultural considerations

Promote Social Cohesion & Trust

- Communal interventions promoted
- Results in improved social cohesion
- VSLA is a foundation for this: promotes trust, social cohesion, and household resiliency







RING Approach to Preventing Conflicts

Beneficiary Selection Process: Transparent & Inclusive

- Well-documented
- Ensured equity in resource distribution

Collective Management of Resources

- Engage communities as collective entity
- Increase community stewardship & reduce conflict







RING Approach to Preventing Conflicts

Sensitization of Beneficiaries on Interventions

- Deliberately discuss conflict prevention
- Communities proactive in recognizing potential conflicts

Rapport Building Between Local Government and Communities

- Local gov't a critical mediator when conflicts arises
- Coordination with traditional authorities







Recommendations & Suggestions

Deliberately Empower Youth

- Year-round productivity & diverse economic opportunities
- Agriculture should be lucrative & attractive
- Access to employable skills or young adult learning
- Easy access to finance or start-up capital

How do we work together as a team in peace building?

- Consider project design with existing or potential conflict in mind
- Flexibility of projects to support others not overtly working on peace
